Fun Day in the Gym



Leadership

Part of our work in school is to encourage all our young people to participate in the life of our school. Traditionally this is done through groups such as Eco-Committee and Pupil Council. While these play an important role, as a staff we were aware that this only involved a small number of children and we wanted to expand the opportunities for more children to feel involved.

As a result we have given each year group a leadership responsibility and tasks to do across the school year. Last term, Primary 6 pupils prepared and led an assembly on Black History Month; their posters are in the main foyer. Next week P3 are leading the fun day to raise money for Children in Need.

P4 Leadership

Over the past few weeks the P4 classes have been working together on creating a Playground Charter. They gathered ideas and thoughts from pupils and staff before deciding what to include. The charter is based on the school values of Kindness, Togetherness, Responsibility and Respect and the children thought hard about what these values look like in the playground. In small groups the children then created posters and voted for their favourite. Here is the winning design created by Ellie, Rosa, Angus and Maisie. Last week a small group of children reported back to Mrs Burns and on Monday of this week, another group of volunteers shared the work with the school at Assembly. We have been really impressed with the team work, thoughtful responses and leadership shown by the P4 pupils.
